

DISTRICT JUDGES POLL RESULTS RE: ADMINISTRATIVE RELEASE

1. Do you believe the Kentucky Supreme Court should end the Emergency Administrative Release Schedule implemented during the COVID-19 Emergency, or do you believe the Kentucky Supreme Court should make the terms of the Emergency Administrative Release Schedule permanent (i.e., until further Orders of the Court)?

Yes, end the Emergency Administrative Orders:

62 votes (72.1%)

No, make the Emergency Administrative Orders permanent:

24 votes (27.9%)

2. In the event the Kentucky Supreme Court does not rescind the Emergency Administrative Release Schedule implemented during the COVID-19 Emergency, do you believe the Court should expand the list of Class D Felony charges that are not eligible for administrative release, or do you believe the Administrative Release Schedule should remain in place as currently written?

Decrease the Number of Class D Crimes eligible for AR:

55 votes (64%)

Leave the Number of Class D Crimes eligible for AR the same:

17 votes (19.8%)

Increase the Number of Class D Crimes eligible for AR:

14 votes (16.3%)

86 out of 114 District Judges responded to the poll questions (75.4%)
